	Which manuscript type?
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Research Article: Describing complete investigations. Maximum 6500 words, including references, figure legends and tables. Review: Only invited contributions. About 8000 words. Technical Report: Short description of the development of a novel method or an improvement or noteworthy modification of an already existing technique or platform used in biotechnology. Maximum 4000 words, two figures and one table. Short Communication: Brief, timely and/or of such importance that rapid publication is warranted. Not subdivided into titled sections, maximum 2500 words, two figures and one table. Other contribution: Forum column (150 to 2000 words), letter, meeting report, book review, ...
	Manuscript style and format OK?
	Manuscripts should be submitted in English (American spelling)
	The first page of the manuscript should contain: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Title (concise, only standard abbreviations). Full author names (including first name) and the name of their institute(s), using superscript numbers after name to indicate multiple affiliations. Keywords (3 to 5). Correspondence: name, title, full postal address, fax number and e-mail address of the author to whom all correspondence (including galley proofs) is to be sent. Abbreviations: alphabetical (excluding standard abbreviations).
	The second page: abstract maximum 200 words, only standard abbreviations allowed
	Number the sections of full papers: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Introduction Materials and methods Results (or Results and discussion) Discussion (or Concluding remarks) References
	Reference format OK?
	References, including those in tables and figure legends, should be numbered sequentially in square brackets [2, 18] in the order in which they appear in the text.
	Reference list (collected at the end of the manuscript) as in the following examples: Journals: [1] Liebeton, K., Eck, J., Identification and Expression in E. coli of novel nitrile hydratases from the metagenome. <i>Eng. Life Sci.</i> 2004, 4, 557–562. [2] Hugo, G., Schmoekel, F. E., Weber, J. C., Jason C. <i>et al.</i> , Bone repair with a form of BMP-2 engineered for incorporation into fibrin cell ingrowth matrices. <i>Biotechnol. Bioeng.</i> 2005, in press. DOI:10.1002/bit.20168.

	Figures and tables OK?
	– Tables with title and footnotes included at the end of the text – Figure legends at the end of the text – Figures should be submitted in original format (preferably TIFF or JPEG) at high resolution (300 dpi) – Please note that a fee has to be charged to the Author for color figure reproduction
	Supporting information online
	– Extensive tables – Text exceeding the maximum word count – Other files like animations and video sequences Has to be submitted online analog with the manuscript body and in final form (no typesetting or galley proofs before publication)
	Lay abstract: Bring your science to a larger public
NEW	In max. 150 words, describe the background, relevance and applications of your work for a non-expert scientific reader. This text may be used to highlight your article in the „in this issue“ section, on various online platforms, for marketing purposes and in sister journals.
	Cover letter complete?
	Please state: 1. Why is the paper suitable for publication in BTJ? 2. Do all the authors concur with the submission? 3. Can you confirm that the work has not been submitted to another journal and will not be published elsewhere within one year after its publication in this journal? 4. Does the manuscript contain experiments using animals? 5. Does the manuscript contain human studies?
	Submit online under http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/btj (if you are not yet author/reviewer for BTJ), create an account first).
